NOTICE OF RACE (INCLUDING AMENDMENT #1)

The organising authorities are RYA Scotland, Scottish Optimist, Topper and Feva Class Associations

In conjunction with Helensburgh SC, Annandale SC, Loch Lomond SC, Loch Venachar SC, Clyde Cruising Club (Dinghy Section) and East Lothian YC

1 RULES

- 1.1 The Regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)
- 1.2 Competitors should note that RYA events will be run in compliance with the principles of the RYA Racing Charter as applicable to both organisers and competitors, details of which can be found at the front of the RYA rule book (Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020), or at www.rya.org.uk/racing/charter)

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The series is open to Optimist, Topper and RS Feva (Travellers 3,4 and 6) class dinghies
- 2.2 In addition the RYAS Spring Champs and Traveller 6 are also open to Laser (Standard, Radial and 4.7s), 420 and 29er class dinghies and Traveller 1 is open to 420s.
- 2.3 Entries for the RYAS Youth and Junior Championships and RYAS Spring Championships will only be accepted through RYA Entry System with the link through to the entry mini-site to available on the RYAS Website (www.ryascotland.org.uk)
- 2.4 Entries for Traveller 1, 2, 5 and 6 will be accepted through the Scottish Travellers website (www.scottishtravellers.org.uk)
- 2.5 All helms shall sign an Entry at registration. Medical forms and consent forms are part of the on-line entry and are required to be completed for all competitors. (Data Protection Act: This is a safety requirement and no data on this will be retained after the event.)

3 FEES

- 3.1 RYAS Youth and Junior Championships and RYAS Spring Championships fee is £30 single handers (topper, optimist and laser) and £40 double handers (feva, 420 and 29er)
- 3.2 Traveller 1, 2 5 and 6 is £20 single handers (topper, optimist and laser) and £30 double handers (feva, 420 and 29er)
- 3.3 Entry fee for late entries will include an additional £10 fee payable as a donation to the RNLI

4 SCHEDULE:

4.1 The six events of the 2017/18 series will consist of:

4.2 The intention will be to run three races each day starting at 12:00 on the Saturday and 10:30 on the Sunday of each event.

5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

5.1 Sailing Instructions will be available at registration.

6 SCORING

6.1 One race at each event is required to be completed to constitute a series. The number of races will be confirmed in the sailing instructions. Series prizes will be awarded based on the overall positions of four out of six of the events and scored according to Appendix A in the RRS.

7 RISK STATEMENT

- 7.1 Rule 4 of the RRS states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."
- 7.2 Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
